Artist of the Month OCTOBER TRUDY BROOKS

BICAS October Artist of the Month, Trudy Brooks claims her love of art developed while studying at high school and teachers' college.

Now living in Dayboro, she was born in England but has spent most of her life in different areas of Queensland. During this time, she took the opportunity to attend as many workshops as possible, including programs organised by the Flying Art School and the University of Southern Queensland.

Trudy has tutored watercolour classes for the Redcliffe Art Society for the last few years. She loves that watercolour paint appears to have a mind of its own which the artist can utilise to enhance the creativity of the work. Her inspiration comes from our brilliant Australian watercolour artists like Greg Allen, Alvaro Castagnet, Joseph Zbukvic and David Taylor. She says she is fascinated by the way these artists use the white of the paper to capture light in their works.



Trudy's art ranges from conventionally realistic to intuitive abstracts. She likes to experiment with different media and substrates, in oil, acrylic, watercolour, alcohol inks and mixed media.

Recently she has also had success in competitions with her digital art. Her passion at present is experimenting with ways to combine digital art with other media including alcohol ink.

Artist of the Month November

Rose's art a feather in her cap

“Arty Island Feathers”

Rose Temelkoski's delicate feather art is all the more remarkable considering its unlikely beginnings.

Rose, formerly of Melbourne, now living at Bongaree, hails from no artistic background.

Her feather interest started about three years ago when she was entertaining her two young grandsons, and made them an Indian headdress on a canvas board.

She was delighted with the result, so she bought another canvas and did another – and another. The ideas came thick and fast and each time she improved and varied her technique. Lo and behold, a new art practice emerged for her - one that has seen her work admired and collected across Australia and overseas. She collects, assembles and arranges discarded birds' feathers into beautiful works of art.

You can see them at the Bribie Island Community Arts Centre, where Rose is **November Artist of the Month**.

The process begins at dawn each day when she can be found walking head down, scouring the grass beneath the trees at Bongaree for tiny feathers shed by birds, ruffling in their tree perches the previous night.



(Rose has a feather collecting authority for Bongaree precinct issued by the Department of Environment and Science.)

Her work is very much more satisfying in Queensland, where colourful, tropical birds abound, she says. In Melbourne, the picture was more black, grey and white.

She painstakingly cleans, brushes and disinfects (by freezing) the feathers before beginning each work.

It can be a long, laborious process. One recent work completed in glorious pink galah feathers, took nine months to collect and arrange.

Rose is meticulous about researching, arranging, mounting and presenting her feather art.

She strives for optimum display by using custom-made Perspex cases from a manufacturer in Brisbane, that give relief and dimension to her works.


From whimsical to wondrous, Rose's feather art is a popular drawcard at Bribie Island Community Arts Centre Gallery.

ALCOHOL INK WORKSHOP

Alcohol inks are fast-drying, highly pigmented, alcohol-based inks that are great to use on any hard, non-porous surface including glass, metal, plastic, glass, ceramic, stone, leather and polymer clay. Once the ink is applied, the alcohol evaporates, leaving the dye behind. Once alcohol ink dries, it can be re-wet with rubbing alcohol (91% Isopropyl Alcohol), allowing for unique and versatile effects that cannot be achieved with water-based products like acrylic paint. Alcohol ink is waterproof, adding to its durable properties.



We will be experimenting with many alcohol ink techniques on a wide variety of surfaces. You will be able to take home many pieces including those items that you bring to class. You will be shown how to make your own alcohol inks cheaply from coloured pens.

All inks, vupo paper, photo gloss paper, isopropyl alcohol & tools supplied.

Just bring **small** items that you would like to paint such as a white candle, a white cup, a clear glass or vase, a white bowl, beads, metal, plastic and small tiles. You may bring one set of 4 items, such as 4 cups.

Pinata Ink colours

Sunbright Yellow, Senorita Magenta, Baja Blue, Passion Purple, Lime Green, Mantila Black, Orange, Sapphire Blue, White & Rich Gold.



