The successful launch of the Matthew Flinders Art Prize for the 20<sup>th</sup> year has brought a palpable "high" to the Centre, and artworks sales from the exhibition are already surpassing expectations.

What a truly magnificent community of artists we live in. BICAS is very proud to have their wonderful works on display for the duration of the MFAP. Whether you agree or disagree with the judges' verdict on the winners, you must admit you'd hate to have their job.

Visitors comments on the exhibition and opening event are very encouraging and the huge work done by the organising committee and associated volunteers is rewarded with great satisfaction at hearing the praise and

admiration of so many. Our thanks to all who were a part of bringing this great event about again.

Our hearts sing when we have people coming to the Centre for the first time and express surprise and delight at its scope and facilities.

But no time to rest on laurels: preparations for the Next Generation Art Prize are well underway. It begins in the Matthew Flinders Gallery on August 19.

We discovered a wealth of talented youngsters around the region in the inaugural event last year. What will come our way in 2018? Organisers Lynne Smith and Sarah Cave are waiting in excited anticipation.

We're moving towards upgrading and streamlining our sales processes and this too, will make life easier for those handling the sales and administration at the Arts Centre. Pleasing as it is to grow our traffic and revenue, it places greater demands on computer systems that were made for when times were quieter.

We have improved the lighting in the Boardroom, deck, MF Gallery foyer, and MF Gallery kitchen by replacing the fluoro tubes and downlights with LED lights - a money-saver and much better illumination now.

Our markets are proving more and more popular each month, thanks to the hard work and initiative of coordinator, Kelly Vass. Lynne Smith is successfully streamlining the catering to fit many different versions of "refreshments" from bus trips, workshops, opening events, club functions, private get-togethers to the markets

We missed our first bid for a

MBRC grant to upgrade the Gallery kitchen to serve a café that will operate six days at the Centre. We are making another application, and with community support, believe we'll be successful this time. As our studio classes and workshops grow, the circle of art love widens and enriches everyone who practises and volunteers here at the Arts Centre. The Opening night of the 2018 Matthew Flinders Art Prize saw a sell-out occasion again, as artists, members and friends of the Bribie Island Community Arts Society gathered to get first look at the 274 entries this year – and to learn the winners. Judges, Wyn Vogel and Karl de Waal, from Brisbane, chose a poignant work by photographer Craig Rohse, from Deception Bay, as the \$5000 winner. Titled "Three Wise Veterans", it depicts three uniformed army personnel in the Confucian monkey 'see no evil, hear no evil and speak no evil pose'. The judges chose it for the "intricate capture of the subjects, the detail highlighting the fine lines and sculpture of the skin, which heightened the emotion in each protagonist's pose. It is a subject the eye can dwell on over and over again. A compelling, conceptual work that combines the two staples of humanity, war and philosophy to comment on realities of modern warfare."

Jennifer Pullman, from North Lakes, won second prize of \$2000 for her landscape of "Innisfail canefields." The judges liked it for 'the gamut of light across its surface, an exceptionally beautiful painting that radiates expressionism, skill and confidence.'

The two highly commended works were a delicate ceramic pot titled "Early Spring" by Doonan potter Dennis Forshaw and an abstract by Graeme Spencer, of Kiels Mountain, titled "Formica & Vegemite". Both win \$500.

The Winner of the People's Choice award is Hazel South for "Bird's Nest".




