

BBB Round 2 is currently underway, with classes in painting, drawing, weaving, mosaics and art journalling.


Bookings for Round 3 will open May 9 and classes will start May 29

Farewell to great Australian landscape artist John Olsen

Vale John Olsen who died this month aged 95.

The celebrated Australian painter was one of few artists to have won the Archibald (2005), Wynne (1969, 1985) and Sulman (1989) prizes in his lifetime.

But he was also known for the warm twinkle in his eye, and his humility. Next month, Olsen's art will illuminate the sails of the Sydney Opera House for Vivid Festival, something that prompted him to describe himself as a "lucky boy".

Olsen was born in Newcastle in 1928, spending time painting and studying in Mallorca before returning home to become one of Australia's best-loved landscape artists. He claimed just a week before he died he was excited to still be painting.

"If there's a disaster, that's only one day and you start again tomorrow. But there you are in the studio and whilst ever you're there, something can happen."

Artist of the Month - April

AARON BUTT

"Presentness is Grace"

Our April Artist of the Month, Aaron Butt follows his solo exhibition at The Hub Gallery Caboolture, titled 'Presentness is Grace'.

This explores the present through light, space and colour in his immediate surroundings, with notions of history and travel.

Central to the display is a portrait of distinguished Bribie Island artist Ian Fairweather, in old age. Surrounding Fairweather are views of Bongaree and Sandstone Point, Fairweather's and Aaron's home suburbs respectively, displayed in vintage recycled mirror frames, some of which are about 100 years old.

Aaron's works also include paintings of his travels to Mulgumpin/Moreton Island, Central Desert and Northern New South Wales.

Artist of the Month - May

Dr Jean Bennett
"The Figurative Body"



Serendipitous return of Lynne's work



The late Lynne Smith built this large pot here at the Arts Centre pottery studio in 1999.



Lynne's friends and fellow potters Sarah Cave and Dianne Hampson with 'Serendipity'

Realising her ambition to make a strong statement object was not without its challenges. This pot was hand built using approximately 120kgs of clay and took over 6 weeks to construct.

It has clear glaze coating with crackle golden glaze trim and the illustration was brushed on using iron oxide. The kiln in which it was fired was assembled around the piece with 2 layers of kiln bricks to a height of 2 metres, gas fired with portable burners to a temperature of 1060degrees Celsius. Taking a few days to cool, the kiln was then dismantled to reveal the work

Lynne named her creation "Serendipity" and it has since travelled to many exhibitions on the Sunshine Coast and won many accolades.

The Bribie Island Community Arts Centre, with which Lynne had a long and happy association before she died in September 2022, thanks her family for donating "Serendipity" back to its place of origin.
